





## Albert Llovera not ready to compete, yet.

In agreement with the decision made a few weeks ago, Albert Llovera and his medical team have decided not to attend the French Rally, which will take place next weekend (from 30th September until 2nd October). The main goal is for Albert's arms to make a full recovery, since he now has four areas of tendinitis in his left arm and one in his right. Due to these injuries, Albert was forced to temporarily stop racing in this year's World Rally Championship S2000 (SWRC).

The Abarth driver had to consider whether he could travel to Alsace to take part in the French event of the SWRC; this was his comment: These last weeks, I've been working really hard together with the physiotherapists at Medisport. I'm really happy with how my physical condition is improving. However, I'm still not fit enough and moreover I don't think it's the best moment to go back to the competition. The risks are high and from my point of view there's no point in taking them. I'd rather wait, get further in my recovery and face the next races completely confident. All in all, Albert thinks it's a pity not to go to France because: It is an asphalt event and it would be an excellent way to prepare for Catalonia.

Thus, it looks like Albert Llovera won't race again until this year's Catalonia-Costa Daurada Rally, the subsequent event of the World Rally Championship, which will take place at the end of October (22nd, 23rd, 24th).
